OUR STORY

Since the 2015 devastating Nepal earthquakes, the team started our charity efforts to provide assistance to rural villages and schools.

In 2018, we found our calling - to build toilets and sanitation facilities for rural schools in Nepal, powered by the core belief that **every child has the Right To Loo.**

The ultimate aim - to create conducive schooling environments so that children have a better chance of completing education to get themselves out of poverty.

Note: Despite the new name, Right To Loo remains a personal project and NOT a nonprofit organisation nor affiliated with any organisation.

MAIN PROJECT AIMS



Build new school toilets with proper sewage system to help prevent water-borne diseases.



Outfit existing classrooms with new furniture to create more conducive learning environments.



Provide schooling necessities such as stationery and fleece jackets for school children.

- Built two toilet cubicles with septic tank and proper sewage system
- Outfitted classroom with good quality furniture and flooring

LIFE CHANGING IMPACT

We continued collecting data from the schools we helped previously and nearby village health posts to find out about the efficacy of our projects.

Compared to previous years, the schools continue to record:

- A drastic drop in diarrhea cases amongst students
- An increase in students attending school

This shows that:

- Children's level of hygiene and sanitation is much better with proper toilets, sewage system and water supply
- This subsequently attracted more students to attend a school with good facilities.

This consistent data shows that our work is making a tangible difference in the children's lives!
